The **Cultural Creative Writing: Story Telling Through Indian Knowledge System Workshop** was organized in collaboration with **Brhat Education Trust**, to introduce participants to the art of creative writing through the rich perspectives of **Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS)** and Indian cultural traditions. The workshop explored storytelling as a means of preserving cultural values, collective memory, identity, and ethical understanding, while also developing practical creative-



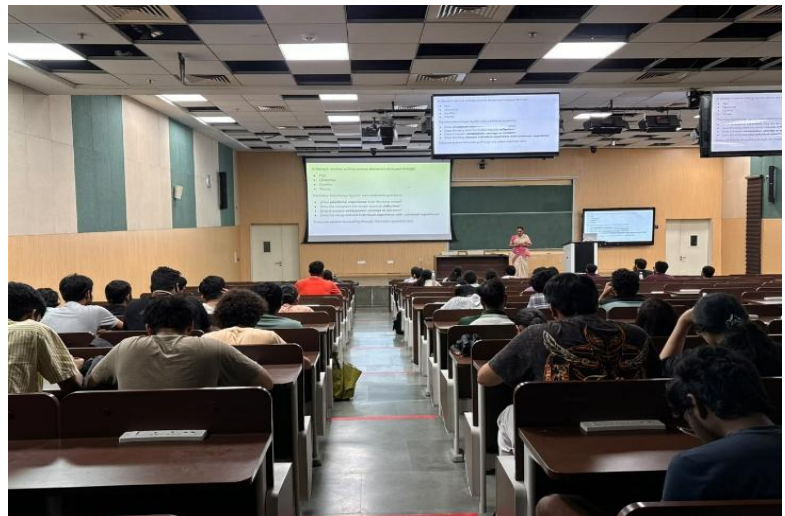
writing skills.





The sessions covered key aspects of storytelling, including **character development, conflict, narrative structure, observation, research, transformation, and Indian aesthetics**. Participants were encouraged to explore Indic approaches to storytelling, with emphasis on values such as *dharma*, *karma*, *compassion*, and character transformation. The workshop also highlighted the potential of storytelling as a medium for reflection, resilience, self-discovery, and cultural expression.

The workshop received an encouraging response, with **178 registrations** from participants interested in creative writing and culturally rooted storytelling. Out of these, **86 participants successfully completed the workshop**, demonstrating active engagement and commitment throughout the Programme.



The workshop provided participants with an opportunity to strengthen their creative-writing abilities while developing a deeper appreciation of India's rich literary and cultural heritage.
