


Overview



She chanted a shloka dedicated to Maa Durga and started her performance with Mangla Charan (Devi Vandana), which included offering flowers to God Jagannath, apologizing to Mother Earth for hurting her, and three types of pranam: Dev Pranam, Guru Pranam, and Sabha Pranam. The co-artists exhibited seamless coordination, providing profound insights through the harmonious interplay of their instruments with Vidushi Kavita Dwivedi.

Next, she taught some postures like Chokha, Tribhanga, and Vakhyachandra, and gave her next performance, 'Pallavi,' dedicated to sculptures, their makers, and music, which progressed from a slow to a fast pace. She gave a short description of different types of Rasas and concluded by performing an act on 'Vatsalya Rasa,' which depicted the bond between Maa Yashoda and Child Krishna without any lyrics, consisting only of expressions and gestures.

After that, she answered a few questions from the audience based on the techniques of the art and ended by describing the 5 Ds for success – Discipline, Dedication, Devotion, Determination, and Divinity.


